Widow wants killers to 'rot in jail'

FAILED JUSTICE



BILLY WINTER MURDER TRIAL

THE wife of slain Wodonga man, Billy Winter, wants his attackers to "rot in jail" after they were sentenced by the Wodonga Supreme Court yesterday.
Ricky Doubleday, 23, of Wodonga, was given a nine-year

jail term with a non-parole period of six years.
Ronald Dale Croxford, 37, of Whorouly, received a maximum sentence of 7½ years, with five years non-parole.
In a statement read by friend Graeme Glover outside

court, Kim Winter said the sentences were "manifestly inadequate" after Doubleday and Croxford attacked and killed her husband with garden stakes.
"The two criminals responsible for Billy Winter's death

deserve considerably more jail time as they effectively committed aggravated murder," she said.
"They both chased him down over some distance, he was trying to defend himself by leaving the scene, and took his

life in a cowardly manner, two on to one in a dark and lonely place.
"From that point, they sacrifice their freedom.
